Up To Date Elks National Foundation Grant Information:

Thank you to everyone who helped with the Beacon Grant - the shopping and donating was such huge helping hand to the Bremerton Backpack Brigade. We donated a combined grand total of 873.7 POUNDS of Food and 291 backpacks!!! We had one receipt that was over 7 FEET LONG!! And all the items donated to the Women's Shelter were so appreciated. This has been a huge help in filling the shelves and pantries for the Backpack Brigade, which will in turn go a long way in feeding and providing much needed food for over 600 children/families. And over at the Women's Shelter, the women and children will have much needed supplies for them to find their way back adjusting into a safe environment in order to grow strong and confident again.

But now we gear up to work on the Gratitude Grant which is roughly 800 newly updated and printed Atlases into the hands of all the 5th grade students in CKSD. This has been a fast paced turnaround as all Atlases were pulled and reprinted by the publishers in literally less than a month and arrived just in time for me to begin the labeling and mass delivery to our 12 elementary schools in time for Spring Break.

I am also busy working on the Impact Grant, in which we will partner with our local Headstart/ECAP schools delivering books and reading to the children. Last year we did both a Spring and a Fall book/reading event with those preschools and fingers crossed will be able to accomplish that this year. Another great Volunteering opportunity for everyone to take part in, just reach out to me.

I have just applied for the Freedom Grant, which I hope to hear back very soon if we qualified for this amazing grant for our local Veterans. Stay tuned, as I will be needing Volunteers for the fun activities over at Retsil Veteran's Home honoring our local Veterans. I also have another idea which I have been tossing around for awhile which will also include local Veteran's and many chances to volunteer right here at the Lodge for them.

Thank you everyone for being a part of Elks Care Elks Share - these Grants are letting this Lodge exemplify this motto within our community and I thank you all for giving me the chance to be such a part in this.





### The Dahlia Project

If you were in the Lodge last summer, you probably saw and perhaps purchased some of the beautiful dahlias that were grown on our grounds last year. What you may not know is the purpose of growing the dahlias. The idea to start the dahlia project was to designate an area of our grounds for agricultural purposes. The area for the dahlia beds takes up about an acre of our property, which is just over 10 acres. If the dahlia beds could be established and show a profit over three years (from both the sales of flowers and tubers), the Lodge could benefit from a reduction in county taxes. The bonus is that we will have thousands of beautiful flowers to sell and enjoy in our Lodge!

Steve Lamb, one of our PER's, is an experienced dahlia farmer. He was able to share his vast knowledge about dahlias and help us create the beds. An area was selected and plowed for use. In May a small group gathered to prepare raised beds and surround them with a weed-proof cover. The next weekend over 200 tubers were fertilized and planted and supports and a watering system were added. Steve generously not only offered his time and expertise, but also gifted us with the tubers, fertilizer, the weed cloth, stakes, twine, and drip irrigation system. During the summer our RV hosts, Ted and Ann Seibert, made sure the dahlias were watered. When they began to bloom, we were able to cut and offer the dahlias for sale. They were also purchased by different groups for table decorations in the Lodge.

The Dahlia Project will be continuing. Tubers were dug up, cleaned, sorted, and stored in the fall. They will be for sale beginning in April. We will be pre-selling the tubers at the Lodge. We will again be planting around 200 tubers. The committee welcomes help and is looking for some avid gardeners who would like to help support this beautiful project. Planting is tentatively scheduled for the beginning of May. Please contact Dwight Barber or Anne Lawrence if you would like to volunteer.
