Hi everyone, I have moved over to take on the position of Chairman of the House this year.

The bar and restaurant in April had a Tuesday steak night and had over 60 members show up, and all were served in less than 60 minutes. Great job by our volunteers! Checkout the calendar and updates in My Elks app, for new meals we are trying on different days.

We had purchased new ceiling tiles for doing part of the kitchen area, but we are now looking at doing nearly the entire ceiling in the kitchen area except above the cooler/freezer area. First, we must make sure funds are available to purchase the extra tiles. The refacing of kitchen floors is in process, we will have to close the kitchen down for a week to accomplish the resurfacing of the floor. We are looking at the first part of July to close the kitchen down. We have bids on both jobs. The Ladies of Elks have graciously set aside funds that should cover the labor for both jobs, so thank you to the LOE for doing this, it will make the kitchen look better, and easier to clean.

We really need our members to volunteer for a couple hours each month at the lodge to keep the lodge affordable for all. Really please think about what you can do to join in as a volunteer and help your lodge. If more members do not start stepping up and helping in the kitchen to cook, serve, or do dishes, there may be occasions where we must cancel dinners on short notice due to the lack of volunteers. Call me, email me, do like I do, come in, and help so you can learn how to do meals, serve, and do dishes. We also need volunteer bartenders. We have also run short on bartenders and had to pay for an additional bartender. I do not like to do that, but it was needed at an event.

Just wanted to update the Lodge members on the Elks National Foundation Grant progress. We have finished the Beacon/Spotlight Grant, sent off the final report which was accepted. So now we look towards doing the 24-25 Beacon Grant for the present year.

We just finished the last Gratitude Grant delivery of the atlas's to all the 5th Grade students at the 12 CKSD elementary schools, a grand total of just shy of 800 atlas's with a short quiz and bookmarks. It has been an amazing Grant to work with and the volunteers who came out to help deliver and go through the quiz with the kids have been totally AMAZING. I simply cannot thank everyone enough for all your help and support this last month and a half. Now to just weave my way through the final report paperwork and submit that for final review. Once that is done, we can look towards possibly doing the Gratitude Grant for the current 24-25 year as well.

The Impact Grant is our next BIG grant, and I mean that in so many ways. This will be a HUGE \$\$ amount to work with, \$8000 worth of books for our Reading 4 Readiness program. I am finishing up with the purchases of the books for the Spring ECAP/Headstart delivery and look forward to these books being delivered to the Lodge soon. I will be reaching out to everyone to come help with the "labeling and sorting" party so if this sounds like something you would like to help with please let me know. I will also need volunteers to help deliver and read to the students. Again, if this is something you would be interested in please reach out to me as I am also working with the centers to get some dates/times put together.

Our Freedom Grant was submitted and ACCEPTED! I will be looking forward to working with the Retsil Veterans Home to bring some hometown kindness to the residents there. We will be doing 3 different activities there, an ice cream treat cart, a summer BBQ and our serving Christmas Holiday dinner later this year. This is a huge way to reach out to the Veterans there and I look forward to our volunteers doing a fantastic job in the coming months with this Grant. If you are interested in these activities, stay tuned for more information to come.

Again, these ENF Grants cannot be possible without the volunteers who are at the heart of these activities. Each activity has been a lot of time and energy and our Lodge has done a wonderful job in supporting these Grant activities.


